How does that change the story?
Make up a song or a poem about a book or a scene from a book you like.	Read a short story from a collection — graphic novels and comics count!	Read a book based on a movie and then watch the film version. Which was better?	Use Novelist K-8 (visit thelibrary.org/kids/homework) to find a new book to read.	Use a flashlight to read a book or chapter of a book in the dark!
Read a book set in or about another country. Visit Mango Languages on thelibrary.org/research to learn how to speak a short phrase in that country's language.	Record yourself giving a book review about a book you love or hate.	What would the sequel be to your favorite book? Write or draw a picture of what would happen next.	Check out a cookbook and make a recipe from it with a grown-up or friend.	Read a book by an author with the same last initial as yours (Example: If your last name is Smith, read a book by an author whose last name starts with 'S'.)
