Scope:	<p>Hugh Dale Claybough was born on August 30, 1911 to James and Florence Claybough. He entered military service in August of 1942. Upon entering service, Hugh was based at the Sedalia Army Air base in Knobnoster, Missouri. Overseas, he served in Tunisia, Algeria, Sicily, French Morocco and England. Hugh Claybough was a member of the planning staff for the operations section with a troop carrier command squadron that carried out successful paratroop drops during the D-Day invasion.</p> <p>This collection includes a six page letter from Hugh Claybough to his wife Wilma. He is stationed in England at the time of the letter written on June 16, 1944. He speaks briefly about the D-Day invasion and how it is affecting the mail. He speaks of wishing to get back home, but doesn't know how long the war will last. Hugh landed in New York City in September of 1945.</p>
