Welcome to the Library! The Springfield-Greene County Library District is open to all members of our community. This guide is an introduction to library resources available to Hakha-Chin-speaking patrons, including translation services, how to locate and access Hakha-Chin-language materials and research, and community resources.

- **Translation Service**

The Library has access to translation services to help communicate with patrons. Please let a staff member know if a translator is needed.

[Mango Languages](#) is a fun and easy online self-study program to learn English. You can use it free with your library card. You can start learning immediately by selecting Guest Access or you can create a password so each time you return to the page, you can pick up where you left off.

- **Materials in Hakha-Chin**

The Library offers materials in several languages. Search “Hakha-Chin” by Subject in the catalog for any results.

Materials may also be available to stream and download. Try out [Libby](#) and [Hoopla](#). Both are electronic resources that can be accessed in your browser, or via Android or iOS apps. Each requires a library card and setting up an account for access to content.

Periodicals can help keep patrons connected to their culture and country. Many non-English language periodicals are available online through Libby.

100 Civics Questions in English

The 100 civics (history and government) questions and answers for the naturalization test. The civics test is an oral test and the USCIS Officer will ask the applicant up to 10 of the 100 civics questions. An applicant must answer 6 out of 10 questions correctly to pass the civics portion of the naturalization test.
