

Spanish Language Resources

Welcome to the Library! The Springfield-Greene County Library District is open to all members of our community. This guide is an introduction to library resources available to Spanish-speaking patrons, including translation services, how to locate and access Spanish-language materials and research, and community resources.

Naturalization Ceremonies, Western District

The United States District Court for the Western District of Missouri has retained exclusive jurisdiction to conduct naturalization ceremonies for applicants seeking citizenship. The ceremonies are presided over by a United States District Judge, Magistrate Judge, or Bankruptcy Judge and are primarily held in the Kansas City courthouse.

100 Civics Questions in Spanish

The 100 civics (history and government) questions and answers for the naturalization test. The civics test is an oral test and the USCIS Officer will ask the applicant up to 10 of the 100 civics questions. An applicant must answer 6 out of 10 questions correctly to pass the civics portion of the naturalization test.
